





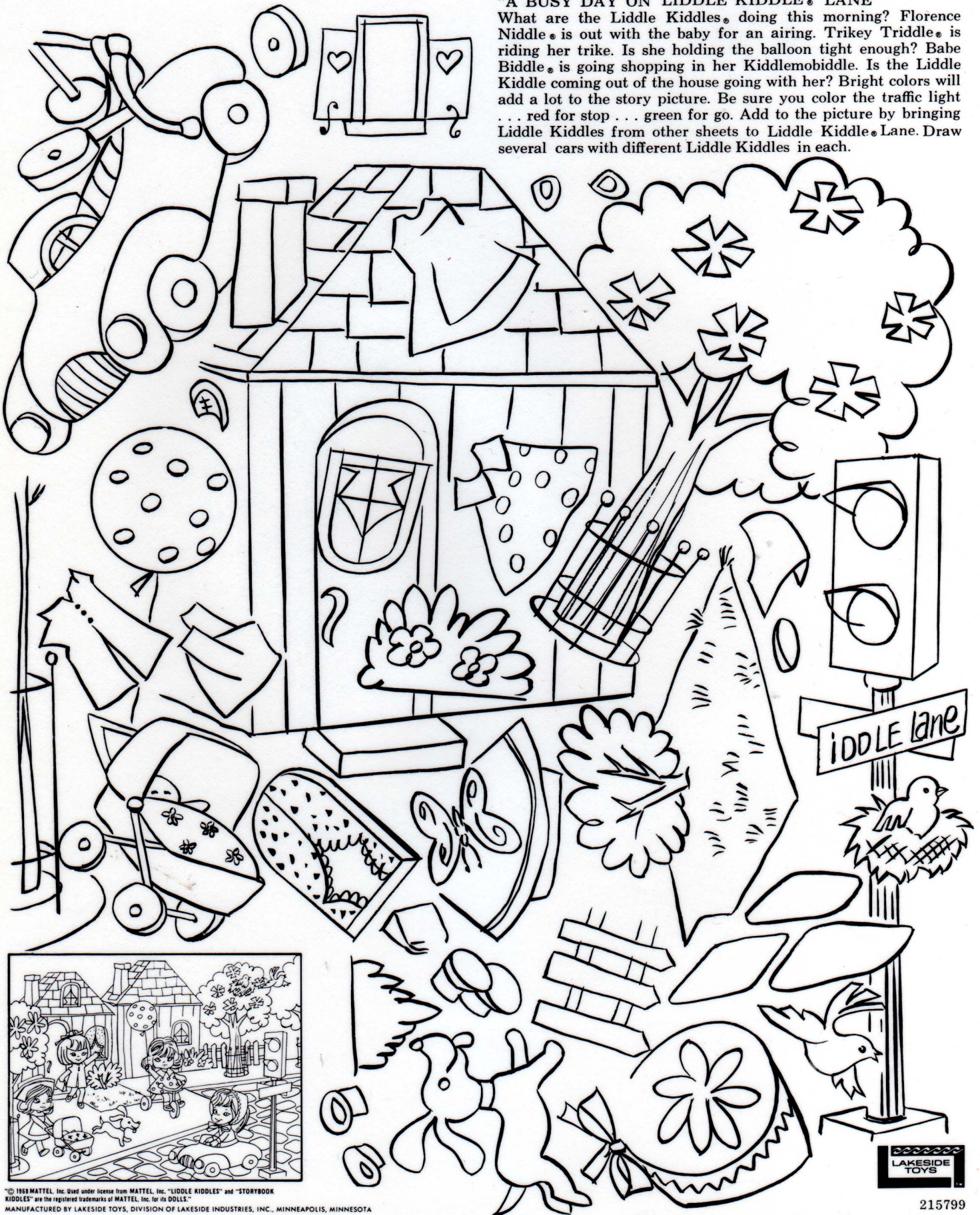
FIGURE GUIDE SHEETS

The figure guide sheets will enable you to make the story pictures as shown in this portfolio as well as illustrations for stories you make up yourself. Don't be afraid to try making pictures using the Liddle Kiddles® in all kinds of activities. How about a parade . . . a beauty contest . . . a play . . . The actions and positions needed to draw the many activities and stories shown on the guide sheets are on the figure guide sheets. Look through the story sheets and decide on a situation you want to draw. Increase light reflection by placing electric drawing desk on white surface. Place figure guide sheet on your desk and lay a piece of drawing paper over it. Draw in the figure by sketching lightly over the lines that show through. Place other sheets on your electric drawing desk and add clothes, hats and other accessories as well as background, etc. Erase any unnecessary lines. Next add color and there's your picture.



"A BUSY DAY ON LIDDLE KIDDLE LANE"

What are the Liddle Kiddles doing this morning? Florence Niddle is out with the baby for an airing. Trikey Triddle is riding her trike. Is she holding the balloon tight enough? Babe Biddle is going shopping in her Kiddlemobiddle. Is the Liddle Kiddle coming out of the house going with her? Bright colors will add a lot to the story picture. Be sure you color the traffic light . . . red for stop . . . green for go. Add to the picture by bringing Liddle Kiddles from other sheets to Liddle Kiddle Lane. 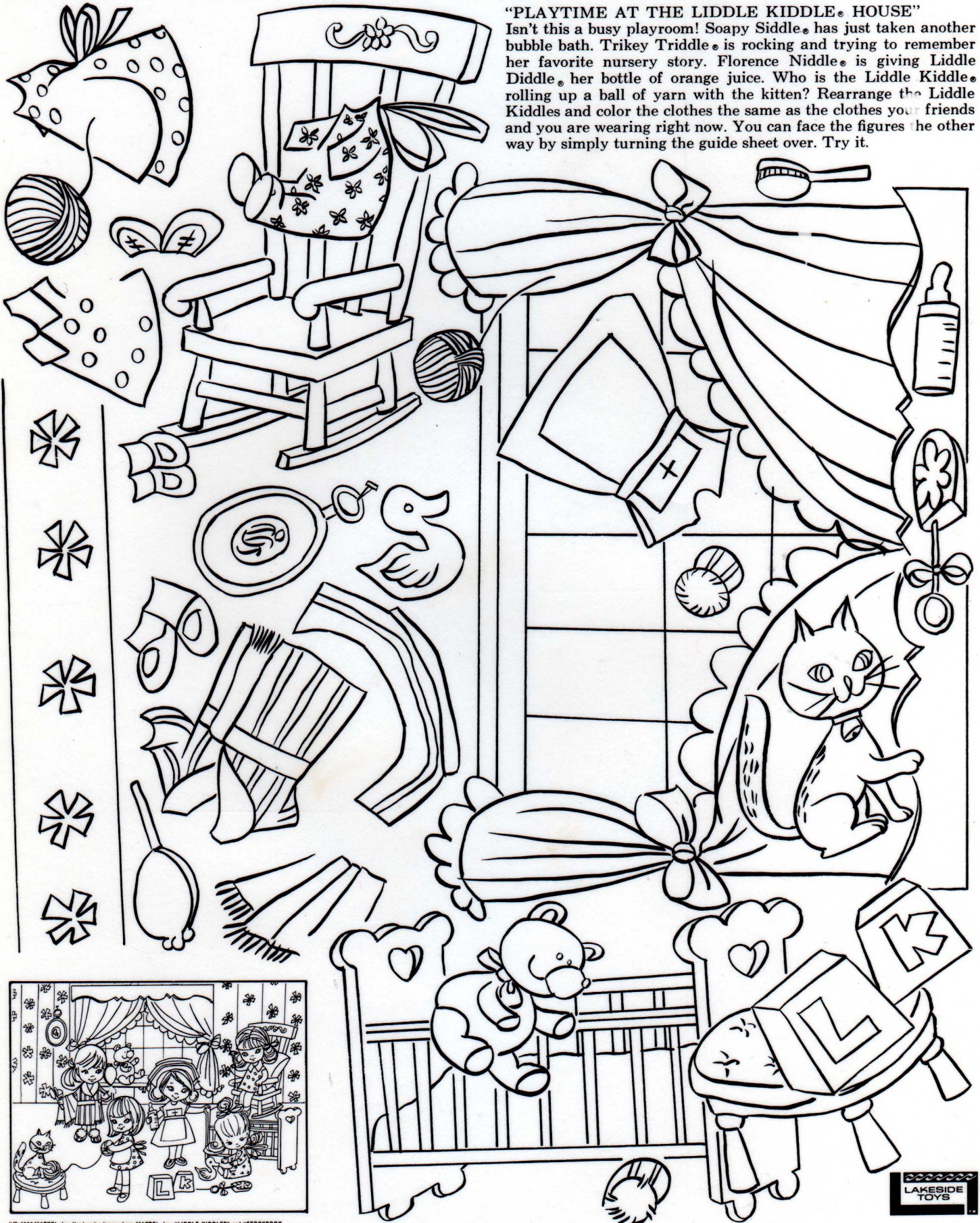
"PETER PANIDDLE"

Draw her sleeping under the tree and sad because she lost her sheep. "Leave them alone and they'll come home dragging their tails behind them." This drawing will show lots of sheep around her. Why not color some of the sheep in pink and some in blue or yellow. Draw animals from other sheets. Birds too . . .
